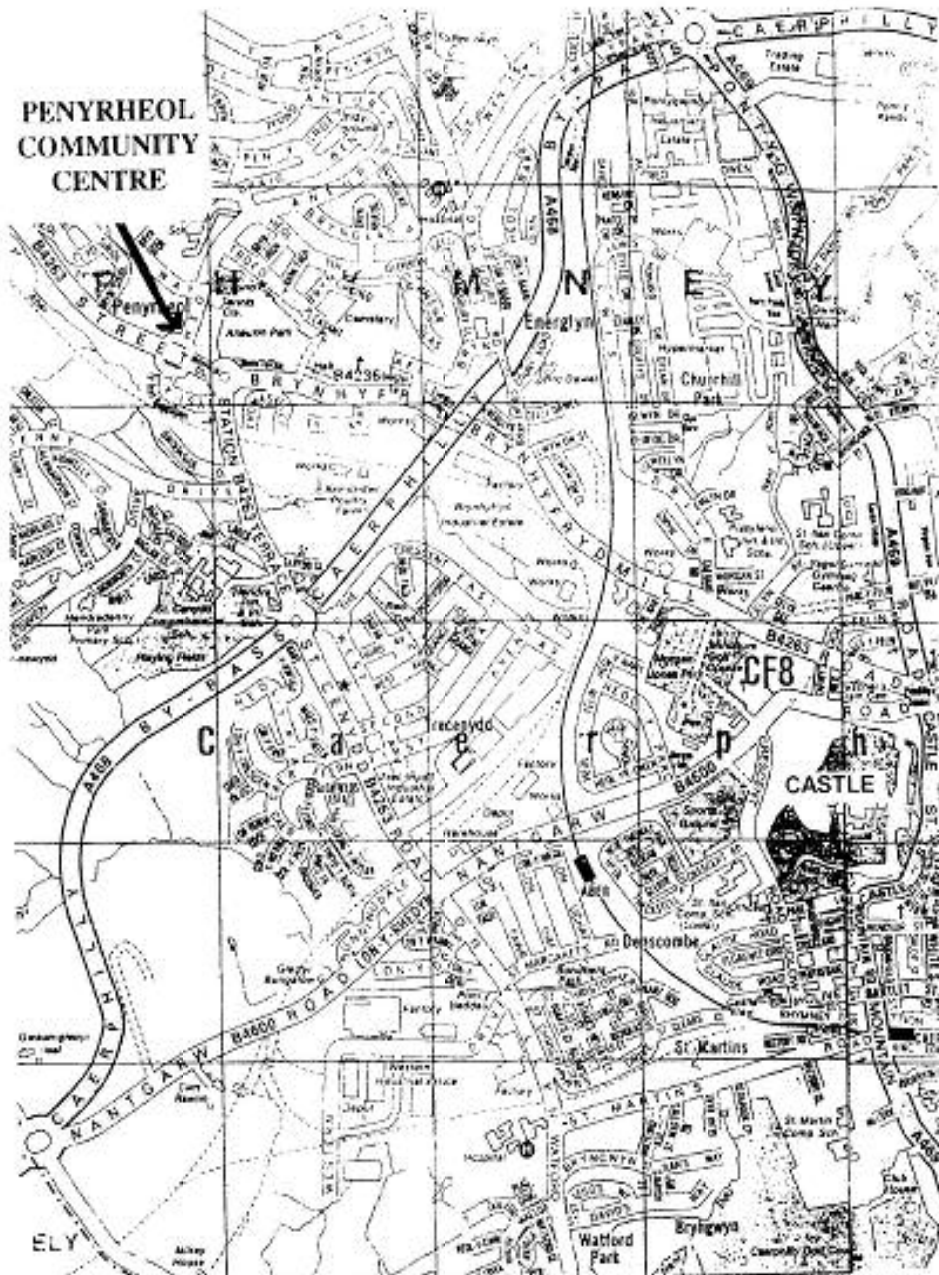

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The show opens at 9.45a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that the exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 10.30a.m.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all the judging has been completed by which time all dogs must be removed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting & benching areas is forbidden except as authorized by the Show Management.
- ENTRY FEES. Non-Members, First entry £5 per dog, subsequent entries £1.50 with the same dog. Members, First entry £ 4.50 per dog, subsequent entries with the same dog £1.50. JH £1 per entry. N.F.C.£1. Membership Fees Single £3, Joint £4, Junior £1
- Prize Money will be awarded in classes 1-18, 1st £3, 2nd £2, 3rd £1.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to alter the order of judging to ensure the smooth running of the Show.
- All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the Show/Event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- BEST PUPPY IN SHOW. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged & which remain unbeaten by any other puppy.
- Withdrawal from Competition– Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition (other than breed classes & Best Puppy in Breed) prior to competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten . A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
- Proviso–For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- BEST IN SHOW - the dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog the same show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex & the Reserve Best of Sex to the declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show & Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
- Proviso - For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dogs, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
- No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by the permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by an advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- The show will be held under Kennel Club Rules & Show Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules & Regulations & it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- The Committee of this Show cannot be held responsible for products advertised or sold by standholders at the Show, & remind exhibitors that such products may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparations of Dogs for Exhibition.
- Exhibitors/handlers are responsible for clearing up & removing any loose hair or fouling from dogs in their charge or any other litter, whether from the car park, exercise area or from any other part of the venue.
- Parents/Guardians please note, well behaved children are welcome but those in charge of children will be held fully responsible for their actions, and any damage caused within the environs of the Show.
- Remedial action will be taken if dogs which are left in cars is found to be in a distressed condition.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATIONS OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition at a show. When a dog is found to have been prepared for exhibition at a show in contravention of these Regulations the exhibitor will be dealt with as if a complaint under Kennel Club Rule 42 had been lodged against them and proved to the satisfaction of the General Committee without prejudice to the right of the exhibitor to make representations to the General Committee in mitigation of the penalty to be imposed at the discretion of the General Committee under Rule 42. The dog will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
2. No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or the body of the coat may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition either before or at the show. Any other substance which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat of a dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed and nothing may be done, calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive, except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
 - b) The removal of dew claws of any breed
 - c) The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds
 - d) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for an objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to & whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, & leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade e.g. a large umbrella & always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter & dehydrated & this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules & Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors / Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show Award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership & entered in Members classes or competing in Member's specials each partner must be at the time of entry be a Member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e.

12.03.12

Wins in variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed & Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog that has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of following options:-

1. Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) & 20.

2. Transfer

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy, Puppy or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height & in the event of there being no equivalent class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY - For dogs of 6 & not exceeding 9 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY - For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR - For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open & Championship shows, (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy & Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First prizes at Championship shows, in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit & Open Classes, whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open classes whether restricted or not.

LIMIT - For dogs which have not become Show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First prizes in all at Championship shows in Limit, or Open classes, confined to Breed, whether restricted or not at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN - For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided & eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN - For dogs of not less than 7 years of age on the first day of the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE - Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at shows held over more than one day, such entries may be on any day from any breed.

CODE OF ETHICS

Club Members:

1. Will properly house, feed, water & exercise all dogs under their care and arrange for appropriate veterinary attention if and when required.
2. Will agree without reservation that any veterinary surgeon performing an operation on any of their dogs which alters the natural conformation of the animal, may report such operation to the Kennel Club.
3. Will agree that no healthy puppy will be culled. Puppies which may not conform to the Breed Standard should be placed in a suitable home.
4. Will abide by all aspects of the Animal Welfare Act.
5. Will not create demand for, nor supply, puppies that have been docked illegally.
6. Will agree not to breed from a dog or bitch which be could in any way harmful to the dog or to the breed.
7. Will not allow any of their dogs to roam at large or to cause a nuisance to neighbours or those carrying out official duties.
8. Will ensure that their dogs wear properly tagged collars and will be kept leashed or under effective control when away from home.
9. Will clean up after their dogs in public places or anywhere their dogs are being exhibited.
10. Will only sell dogs where there is a reasonable expectation of a happy & healthy life & will help with the re-homing of a dog if the initial circumstances change.
11. Will supply written details of all dietary requirements & give guidelines concerning responsible ownership when placing dogs in a new home.
12. Will ensure that all relevant Kennel Club documents are provided to the new owner when selling or transferring a dog, and will agree, in writing, to forward any relevant documents at the earliest opportunity, if not immediately available.
13. Will not sell any dog to commercial dog wholesalers, retail pet dealers or indirectly allow dogs to be given as a prize or donation in a competition of any kind Will not sell by sale or auction Kennel Club registration certificates as stand alone items (not accompanying a dog).
14. Will not knowingly misrepresent the characteristics of the breed nor falsely advertise dogs nor mislead any person regarding the health or quality of a dog.

Breach of these provisions may result in expulsion from Club membership, and/or disciplinary action by the Kennel Club and/or reporting to the relevant authorities for legal action, as appropriate.

ABOUT YOUR JUDGE – GINA SIMPSON

My interest in dogs started in 1979, when I bought my first Saluki. I began exhibiting in 1980, and for a period of 23 years I owned and exhibited six.

I started judging Salukis and other Hound breeds at Open shows in 1990, and awarded my first set of CCs in Salukis in 1999. I have awarded CCs in Salukis at Championship show level in the UK six times and have also judged Salukis at Championship level in Norway and Sweden.

Although I stopped exhibiting in 2003, I maintained my interest in judging Hound breeds and other canine related activities.

I was previously the Secretary of the Hound Club of Wales for a period of 15 years, and am also the Assistant Secretary of the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society (Canine Section). Additionally, I serve on the committees of several Canine Clubs/Societies in South Wales, and am the Show Manager for the Welsh Kennel Club.

I first had the pleasure of judging Beagles at Open show level in 1995, and am both delighted and honoured to be judging the Welsh Beagle Club Open show in 2012.
